Leeds the city

Leeds is in Yorkshire, Northern England - a lively, multicultural city in the middle of Great Britain. It's one of the largest financial and business services centres in the UK outside London, and a centre for culture and entertainment, with world-class art collections, several theatres and museums, and many bars and restaurants

The city is one of the UK's top shopping destination and boasts over two miles of traffic free shopping and beautiful Victorian and Edwardian arcades. with shops of every kind. Leeds has a vibrant nightlife, with clubs and bars offering music for all tastes. There are lots of live music venues, including the University's students' union.

With over 60,000 students, Leeds is one of the UK's most exciting cities. Its comparative affordability and student-friendly atmosphere make it an ideal place to live and learn for a semester or a year.

Its central location makes Leeds a perfect starting point for trips to London, Manchester or Edinburgh, all within three hours on the train. The city is well connected to the rest of the UK by affordable and extensive coach and rail services.

Leeds Bradford Airport is only 30 minutes away from the University and provides regular flights to cities across Europe. A flight to Paris or Amsterdam takes only 90 minutes.

Leeds is one of the UK's greenest cities, with more than 4,000 hectares of green space. You'll find many areas of natural beauty and interest around the city, such as Roundhay Park, Temple Newsam, Harewood House and Kirkstall Abbey.

The Yorkshire Dales, Peak District and Lake District national parks are all within easy reach of Leeds. Historic locations like York, Harrogate, Haworth and Scarborough are just a day trip away.

Entry requirements

For entry in either September 2024 or January 2025, applicants must have completed at least one year of study and be in good academic standing at their home university, with a grade of Upper Second Class (UK system), GPA of 3.0 (US system), 5.5 (Australian system) or equivalent. Some subject areas will expect to see a portfolio of work or performance recording before accepting applicants onto particular modules, for example Studio Fine Art, Design and Music Performance.

Language requirements

If English isn't the main language of your home country then applicants are required to submit evidence of their level of English language. The standard entry requirement is IELTS 6.0 (overall), with 5.5 in each component, or equivalent qualification.

However some teaching schools have higher language requirements (IELTS 6.5 overall with 6.0 in each component or equivalent qualification), including Business, English, Fine Art, History of Art and Cultural Studies, Linguistics, Law, Media and Communication, Philosophy, Politics and International Studies.

English language programme and Study Abroad/Exchange

Applicants who want to take an English language course before their semester or year of study should apply via the Study Abroad Office for a combined English Language and Study Abroad Programme. Applicants may be required to submit a Secure English Language Test certificate and may be restricted to Level 1 and 2 modules during their semester or year of study.

Applicants study English in the Language Centre, then complete a semester or year of regular modules. There are a number of entry points depending on the academic calendar at your home institution and your level of English.

Applicants meeting the English language requirements but wishing to improve their English can also take English language modules at the Language Centre during their regular semester or year of study.

Application procedure

Exchange students must first be nominated by their home institution. All applicants should then complete an online application form, accessed from the Study Abroad website.

As part of the process you must also upload your supporting documents:

- an official transcript from your home institution
- a description of the grading system at your home institution
- a copy of the personal information page of your passport
- if necessary, evidence of English language ability.

Fee-paying Study Abroad Programme

The University welcomes applications from students applying directly onto the Study Abroad programme and paying tuition fees directly to the University of Leeds. Students can choose to study for one semester or the full academic year.

Application deadlines

Semester 1 (September start)

To apply for semester 1 or a full year the starting month is September with a deadline for application of 15 April.

Semester 2 (January start)

To apply for semester 2 the starting month is January with a deadline for application of 31 October.



Next steps

To be eligible to apply for our summer school you should be enrolled at a university, or be a recent graduate and meet our requirements:

Entry requirements

Minimum academic requirements

- 50 average (UK scale)
- 2.5/4.0 grade point average (or equivalent)

Minimum English language requirements

If the country you study in isn't on the Student visa exceptions list (https://www.gov.uk/student-visa/knowledge-of-english), you'll need to submit evidence that you meet our language requirements. If you're being taught in English at your home university, you don't need to provide a language certificate. Instead, we'll ask you to provide evidence that you are taught in English.

Minimum language requirements:

- IELTS 5.5 (5.5 overall with no component lower than 5.0)
- TOEFL (iBT) 72 (72 overall, listening: 17, reading: 18, writing: 19, speaking: 20)
- TOEIC: listening 400, reading 385, speaking 160 and writing 150
- Password Skills 5.5 overall (5.5 overall with no component lower than 5.0)
- Duolingo English Test: (90 overall with no individual component below 90)

If you have not taken one of the above tests, you can refer to the equivalent English Language qualifications we accept for your country or region on the LISS website.

Incoming study abroad and semester or year exchange

Minimum GPA requirements

60 average (University of Leeds system) 3.0 (US system)

5.5 (Australian system – on the 7.0 scale)

Strategic partners may be able to take part in our Open Access scheme for the admission of students who don't meet standard entry requirements. If you would like to discuss our Open Access scheme or if a student has not met the grade requirement and there were factors that negatively affected their grades, please contact the Study Abroad Office as we can take mitigating circumstances into account and review such requests on a case-by-case basis.

Minimum language requirements

Language evidence is not required when applying from a country on the UKVI exceptions list: www.gov.uk/student-visa/knowledge-of-english

All other applicants will need to provide English Language evidence to the University as part of their application. The standard entry requirement is IELTS 6.0 (overall), with 5.5 in each component, or equivalent qualification.

At our discretion applicants for a single semester, and who are taking a taught degree programme in the medium of English at their home university, do not need to provide English Language evidence, if they apply for a Visitor Visa which allows them to remain in the UK for up to 6 months.

Please note: 1) We must base decisions on the language level shown on the last evidence the student submits. 2) Some teaching schools have a higher requirement than our standard minimum.

Undergraduate module (course) information

As a study abroad student you can apply for modules from across the University. Please look at our module catalogue and search by 'incoming study abroad'.

Priority will be given to students who study the related subject as their degree major. Specific academic subject guidance should be checked at **www.leeds.ac.uk/incomingschoolguidance**

Medicine and Dentistry modules cannot be studied unless students are applying via a specific exchange agreement with these disciplines.

Postgraduate module (course) information

Some teaching schools may allow exchange students to apply for postgraduate modules. The postgraduate module catalogue can be accessed from **www.leeds.ac.uk/incomingstudy**

Pre requisites must be met and applicants should carefully consider if there are suitable modules available before submitting an application.

Applicants should note that academic transcripts for postgraduate modules are not released until the November after studies have ended.

Course load per semester

60 Leeds credits per semester/120 credits for the full academic year.

Students may take 50 credits per semester and still be considered a full-time student, but must have this agreed with their home university.

10 Leeds credits (5 ECTS) is equivalent to 100 hours of study, including lectures, seminars and independent learning.

Module (course) duration

Some modules take two semesters (the full academic year) to complete. These modules are listed as 'Semester 1 and 2' in the module catalogue. Students cannot study a 'Semester 1 and 2' module if they are coming to Leeds for one semester only.

Most modules in these schools are 'Semester 1 and 2' modules:

- Chemical and Process Engineering (CAPE)
- Design (Fashion Design and Fashion Marketing modules)
- Healthcare (HECS)
- Mechanical Engineering (MECH and PDES)

Therefore, students coming to Leeds for one semester only, would need to choose modules in other disciplines or teaching schools to make up their credit load. They will need to consider carefully if their intended programme of study meets the requirements of their home university.

Fine Art, Design and Performance Music

Studio practice modules in the teaching schools of Fine Art, Design and Performance Music modules are open to students studying these subjects as majors at their home university.

Students should send a portfolio (Fine Art and Design) or performance recording (Music) to the relevant teaching School to obtain permission to apply for studio/performance modules. The portfolio check process can be found at

Examinations

There are two exam periods at the University of Leeds: one in January and one in May/June.

If Semester 1 students find that teaching at their home university clashes with the January exam period, they can apply to take exams at their home university. They will pay a fee for this.

LISS modules are assessed by other means, such as coursework, presentations, practical assignments in class.

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Transcripts

All undergraduate official transcript of records will be released in late-July after the results are officially released.

Semester 1 only students will receive an electronic provisional transcript in late February. Please note that these marks remain provisional, and are therefore subject to change, until they are officially released in July.

Postgraduate marks are officially released in November, so official transcripts for students who have taken postgraduate modules may not be available until this time.

LISS students will receive their transcripts in September.
